



Land Acknowledgement

We acknowledge that Western University is located on the traditional lands of the Anishinaabek (Ah-nish-in-a-bek), Haudenosaunee (Ho-den-no-show-nee), Attawandaron (Add-a-won-da-run), and Lūnaapéewak (Len-ahpay-wuk) peoples, on lands connected with the London Township and Sombra Treaties of 1796 and the Dish with One Spoon Covenant Wampum.

With this, we respect the longstanding relationships that Indigenous Nations have to this land, as they are the original caretakers. 





INTRODUCTION

It's a practice. It's an ongoing decision to unlearn internalized biases and discrimination, and to disrupt the systems and practices we navigate on a daily basis.








































































